When designing a Coordinated Community Response it is important to understand the complexities that people of diverse backgrounds encounter with the Criminal Justice System. This is particularly true for immigrant survivors of domestic and sexual violence where the unintended consequences of interventions designed for the white middle class can result in deportation and worse. - What makes the Criminal Justice System so difficult for immigrant communities and how its effects are magnified in cases involving domestic and sexual violence,
- What can be done to protect victims without re-victimizing them, and hold offenders accountable, and
- How to incorporate attention to the unique aspects and needs of immigrant communities into your CCR.
